2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST:

5. HILLFORTS WARD REPORT:

- -Ukrainian families have started to arrive in surrounding villages. DC have a lot of additional responsibilities administering Government funding in such areas as school places, medical provision, social services and language support. The demands on DC will be long term as not all needs will be apparent immediately. Checks are being carried out on hosting families and the Ukrainian guests. More information can be found on the DC website.
- -Dorset council have signed a 20-year lease with the NHS for them to continue their outpatients and rapid access clinics at Southwarks House in Dorchester.
- -The Tour of Britain cycling race will be in Dorset 12/09/2022. Starting at Wareham and passing through Bere Regis, Milton Abbas, Okeford Fitzpaine and south of Blandford ending at Ferndown.

- -Cllr Harman requested that the Clerk check the previous approved Manor Farm Barn application to see if the tree screening had been specified. Clerk/Chairman
- -Cllr Harman raised that local residents have requested the establishment of a public footpath to extend from a suitable point on the footpath leading to the C13 Higher Shaftesbury Rd to a point on Bushes Rd opposite to the entry to the Jubilee Way footpath. **Clerk/Chairman**

7. MATTERS ARISING:

- -Community Governance Review Clerk and Chairman to prepare a response and circulate to PC for approval before submitting. Deadline 23/05/2022
- -Section 106 Agreement for the Wyatt Homes site North of Manor Farm Close currently under construction DC have requested quotations for works to be attributed to the S106 for the Play areas, outdoor spaces, former school field. The amount listed in the S106 for education will not come directly to Pimperne Primary School but be added to DC's education budget.

-Mr King has been asked for his advice on what species of tree would be a good choice for planting at the Queen's Jubilee Celebrations on June 5th in support of the Queen's Green Canopy campaign. It was specified that a flowering tree would be preferred.

a) New Applications-

-P/FUL/2022/01311-25b Rivers House-Sunrise Business Centre-Replace existing UPVC doors and windows. Installation of Photovoltaic arrays to roof, creation of hardstanding areas for new substation enclosure and air source heat pump enclosure – No objection.

b) Approved Applications

P/DCC/2021/01597-Land south-east of Sunrise Business Park and north of the A350 Blandford Bypass.

Development of a waste management centre for the bulking and transfer of waste and recyclables, comprising a covered waste transfer station, with waste storage, sprinkler tank and pump house, and a split-level household recycling centre with vehicle loading bays and partially covered central yard, a dedicated re-use centre, WEEE storage building, office building, staff parking area, weighbridge and associated landscaping. Formation of new access from A350.

-The Chairman asked Dorset Cllr Jespersen if the AONB's comments on this application had been observed when discussing this application - Cllr Jespersen confirmed that they had.

c) Outstanding Applications

P/FUL/2022/01026-The Farquharson Arms- Salisbury Rd-Change of use and conversion of Public House to 2 dwellings. Demolish existing outbuilding and erect 2 no. dwellings, Form Associated Parking and Landscaping

P/FUL/2022/00788- Land at E 390615 N Hyde Farm Salisbury Road, Pimperne – Install 8 rapid electric vehicle charging stations, form new access road, entrance and road to access charging stations. Form 8 EV charging bays along with equipment.

- -P/FUL/2021/05709 -The Long House, Land at Salisbury Road- Erection of 7 no. dwellings, form new vehicular access and parking- The PC objects to this application
- -P/HOU/2021/00866-Cornerways-LettonClose-Erection of garage (amended description agreed December 06 2021).

P/FUL/2021/02760 – 1 St Peters Close, Pimperne- Erect 1 no. dwelling- PPC Objects to this application- Not in keeping with the other properties in St Peters Close, dangerous vehicular access to this site.

- -P/FUL/2020/00411- Land East of Franwill Business Estate, Down Road Erect 15 no. dwellings including 40% affordable, form new vehicular access and carry out associated development.
- -P/OUT/2020/00026- Land North and East of Blandford--Hybrid planning application for the phased development for up to 600 no, dwellings and non-residential uses comprising: outline planning application (to determine access) to develop land by the erection of up to 433 no dwellings (Use class C3), local centre with flexible floor space including Commercial, Business and Services (Use class E), Drinking Establishments and hot food takeaways (Use class Sui Generis) and Local Community (Use Class F2); land for a three-form entry primary school and associated playing pitches (Use Class F1 Learning and non-residential institutions); form public open space, replacement allotments including allotment building, new sports pitches, parking, access, infrastructure, landscaping and carry out ancillary and site preparation works, including demolition of existing buildings and removal of existing allotments. Full planning application to erect 167 no. dwellings (Use Class C3), form public open space, attenuation basins, parking access, infrastructure, landscaping and carry out ancillary and site preparation-

d) Refused applications:

-P/FUL/2021/023340-The Lodge, Church Road – Erection of 4 no. dwellings, formation of new vehicular and pedestrian access, and 5 no. additional parking spaces: -REFUSED.

e) Other Planning Issues

-Woodbury Site.

- There has not been any progress with this matter, Mr Mulholland has not carried out the clearance of the wall and raised a boundary issue. This issue should not delay the removal of the wall – Cllr Jespersen to speak again to Mr Foot at DC as this should now be an enforcement issue.

a) Tree Officer –

-The copse pack from the Woodland Trust has not yet arrived.

-The Lime tree removed by operatives at the Wyatt Homes Site has now been replanted, Cllr Sutton will water the tree. Cllr Sutton

b) Rights of Way:

- -2 humps in the footpath in Church Road at Fiveways.
- -Dog bin Paul Bakers Lane, there is a raised trip hazard.
- -Cllr Argles to inspect and report both of the above.

c) Highways:

- -Church Rd is still closed although vehicles are still trying to come through the village.
- -The Chairman and the Clerk had attended a Teams meeting with DC Highways to discuss the possibility of a crossing on the A354 to the Nursery. It was established that it would be unlikely as the footfall was not great enough however DC Highways have agreed to consider the provision of drop curbs each side of the road and install paved area to the verge to make it easier

for those with buggies and small children easier to cross. Chairman to meet with Mrs Cooper at the nursery to establish the numbers who travel to the nursery on foot and cross the A354. DC have the budget to install 10 dropped curbs per year and this would be 2 of them.

-Still waiting for the sign and the 321 strips at the Salisbury end of the A354 to be moved up. Unfortunately, the DC Sign Gang are currently employed changing the car parking signage re: increased charged so other works have been interrupted. Chairman/Clerk
