



## Walk 4 The Jubilee Trail (3 1/2 miles)

From the Village Hall turn left and walk along Church Road, passing St Peter's Church on the right, keep right at the road junction, pass Parr Grove and Hyde Gardens on the left. Where the road bears left to the A354, continue along Church Road with the stream on your left to the footbridge opposite the Farquharson Arms. Turn right into Chapel Lane, at the top of the lane take the footpath on the right, through the metal gate and follow this way-marked footpath with open fields to the left. Climb over a stile then through a metal gate followed by a wood kissing gate and a further metal gate before reaching the back of St. Peter's Church. Go through the metal gate on your left following the sign uphill across the field to reach the hedge row on the right. Continue uphill with the hedge on your right until reaching a gateway on the corner of Bushes Road. Turn left and continue along the metalled road for about half a mile, passing the farm dairy buildings on the right.

The Jubilee Trail is signposted on the right near the brow of the hill and shortly before the cross roads. (\*1) Follow the Jubilee Trail, through an avenue of trees, over a stile walking straight ahead across the next field. Go over a second stile and bear slightly right heading through a field to a large double metal gate where it meets a stony track. Go through the gate and turn right on to the track descending to a junction with a metalled road. The Jubilee trail turns left here, but you turn right into Newfield Road leading back to the Village Hall car park.

### \*1 Point of Interest

*The area between the Jubilee Trail and the cross roads is the site of an iron age settlement which was excavated in the 1960s. The enclosure covered an area of 11.5 acres and contained the remains of a circular timber house 13 metres in diameter with a baked clay hearth. Many of the excavated items, including a bronze finger ring, shale bracelet, chalk lamps and pottery may be seen at Wimborne Museum. A replica of Pimperne Round House has been created at the Butser Ancient Farm project near Petersfield.*
